11. God is Sovereign - 16

God not only created mankind but he oversees what goes on. This verse says he sees us in the embryo stage and knows who we will be. He sees the finished product before it is formed (Romans 11:33-36).

12. God Knows Our Lives - 16

God knows the number of our days on earth and predetermines events and circumstances to fit together according to His foreknowledge. Things happen according to his plan (Romans 8:28).

13. God Is Awesome -17,18

God's mind and thoughts are far beyond ours. He knows us before our conception; our birth date; and the day of our death. One translation of verse 18 says, "*When I to come to the end, I will still be with you.*" What a great comfort to know God is with us to the very end of our days.

14. God is in Control - 19 - 22

David is so amazed at the almighty mind, knowledge and revelation of God, that he can't understand why everyone is not a believer. His only answer is that they must be ungodly people deserving of God's

judgment. He wants God to act now! He lived before the cross and did not know of the love of God in Jesus Christ (John 3:16,17).

15. God Will Judge Us - 23, 24

He started out in v. 1, saying God has searched me. Now as he stands before a powerful, holy God, he is aware of his own sinfulness and asks God to search him and judge his commitment, his trust and his lifestyle as a believer. Paul speaks of that day when we give an account to God (Romans 14:12, Acts 17:31).

Let me ask you. Are you ready to meet God? (Matthew 16:24-28) Are you a committed believer?

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Who Am I, Lord Psalm 139

Often we hear of people who are passing through an identity crisis. They are struggling with an age old question, "Who am I?" We all ask this question occasionally but perhaps it is asked more frequently today because of the prevailing scientific view of the universe. That view tells us that our earth is but a speck in a vast universe and we are struggling mortals on an obscure planet located in a second rate galaxy among billions of other galaxies.

Such an outlook tends to make us feel very insignificant. It contrasts sharply with the Biblical view of man and especially the view that deals with man in relationship to God.

Psalm 139 describes a man who is thinking about himself and his relationship to God. If you are struggling with an identity crisis and you are not sure just who you are, then this Psalm can be a real help to you.

We can learn many things about God and our relationship to Him in this magnificent personal encounter.

1. God Understands Us - 1

The Psalmist asks, "How well does

God know me?" Then he gives the answer. *"O LORD, you have searched me and you know me."* God knows all about us and knows us intimately.

2. God Knows Our Thoughts - 2

God has the ability to know what we are thinking and doing. When we are resting and active; our conscious and unconscious thoughts.

3. God Knows Our Ways - 3

He knows our secrets, the choices we make and the directions we take. All that we say and do is known to him (Romans 2:16, Hebrews 4:13).

4. God Speaks Our Language - 4

He is familiar with our words and expressions. He understands our language and dialect. He is an international interpreter. No one is left out. He speaks all languages.

5. God Knows Us Best - 5, 6

God is active in our past our future and our present. God knows us better than anyone else (Luke 16:15).

6. God Is Always With Us - 7, 8

God is ever near. No destiny can separate us from God. We are all responsible to Him and will one day give a personal account of our lives to him.

7. God Goes Before Us - 9, 10

The presence of God is not to be feared. It provides strength, comfort and confidence. It is the assurance that wherever we go, we are not left alone, because God is with us, to help us.

8. God Never Leaves Us—11, 12

No darkness, physical or mental can hide us from God. Struggles with darkness or even the dark forces of evil cannot separate us from God.

9. God Created Us - 13, 14

In these verses David goes back to the original creation of mankind. The act of creation is repeated every time a baby is born. Each one of us by the combination of two cells are created a brand new being with a unique personality.

10. God Designed Us - 14, 15

David is truck with the process that is necessary in the forming of a human being. The word 'frame' indicates the basic human cell structure. Each element of the human body was designed by God. It is wonderful to behold. The word 'woven' means we are embroidered; neatly put together to make a beautiful whole
